



VERSATILE K9 TRAINING RULES

1. Dogs that are ill or suspected of being ill should not attend class. Should it become necessary, the instructor may excuse a dog from a class for any medical reason or lameness. It may become necessary to ask for a slip from a veterinarian to allow your dog back into class.
2. Spectators are allowed but must remain quiet and off the training area. Small children must be supervised by an adult (other than the person participating in the lesson).
3. Handlers are responsible for mishaps by their dogs and will clean up immediately.
4. Bitches in season are allowed in training but must be announced to the training staff PRIOR to the start of class.
5. Handlers under the age of 12 will be allowed only with special permission of the instructor. Junior handlers are required to have a parent on the premises during the training session.
6. The dog will be kept properly fed and groomed at all times.
7. PATIENCE, PERSISTENCE, PRACTICE AND PRAISE must be remembered in the training of your dog. Inappropriate conduct of the handler will not be tolerated. Participants may be removed from a class at the discretion of the instructor. Re-admittance to class must be discussed with Scott VanDenHaute, owner/director of Versatile K9 Training Academy.
8. Dog to dog interaction is allowed during VK9 training sessions only with permission of attending instructor.
9. Prior to attending class, make sure your dog's remote collar is charged and properly fitted. Do not arrive unprepared with the remote hanging on the lanyard around your neck!
10. Dogs entering training area must arrive either on leash or at a heel. Remember, your dog is learning ALL of the time!
11. Proper training attire includes closed-toe, full heeled shoes or boots. Sandals, clogs, flip-flops, high heels and bare feet ARE NOT ALLOWED. Be prepared for sudden weather changes, we will train outside whenever possible.
